



DO DAH DAY BAND LINEUP: SOME OLD, SOME NEW, ALL GREAT

Birmingham, Ala, 4-2-10: Do Dah Day welcomes back bands old and new for the 31st annual parade and music festival, May 15, in Caldwell and Rhodes Parks in Birmingham's Southside. This year's line up includes bands that played way back whenwhen the festival was just getting started. Bands such as Telluride and Locust Fork were local favorites and their early appearances at Do Dah Day helped cement their status in Birmingham as fixtures on the music scene.

The line up at Caldwell Park includes The Perishables, Roots Posse, The Blades, Act of Congress, as well as Telluride and Locust Fork. Rhodes Park will feature Hearts, Tonal Vision, Matt Devine Band, Amazing Sea Monkeys, Enemy Lovers and Tim Brantley.

Do Dah Day is a free music festival and parade to raise money to support homeless animals. The parade, beginning at 11:01 a.m., winds along Highland Ave. Bands begin playing at 11:31 in Rhodes Park and 12:01 in Caldwell. Bring your dog, cat, lizard, llama or other friendly animal and enjoy the music, the sights, concessions, merchandise and more.

Do Dah Day has grown from a small gathering of some 200 people who raised \$400 for charity, to an event boasting attendance of more than 45,000 people and thousands of dogs (and a few other of the braver types of critters) each year. Since 1992, Do Dah Day has raised more than \$700,000 for organizations that care and support homeless animals.

Do Dah Day is an all-volunteer organization and enlists the support of more than 200 animal-loving volunteers to run the event each year.
