Birmingham, Ala, 2-17-10: Back for its 31st fabulous year, Do Dah Day 2010 is set for Saturday, May 15, in Birmingham's Highland neighborhood. The parade and all-day music festival will take place in Caldwell and Rhodes Parks, and along Highland Ave.

Do Dah Day is a free music festival and parade to raise money to support homeless animals. The parade, beginning at 11:01 a.m., winds along Highland Ave. Bands begin playing at noon. Bring your dog, cat, lizard, llama or other friendly animal and enjoy the music, the sights, concessions, merchandise and more.

Do Dah Day has grown from a small gathering of some 200 people who raised \$400 for charity, to an event boasting attendance of more than 45,000 people and thousands of dogs (and a few other of the braver types of critters) each year. Since 1992, Do Dah Day has raised more than \$700,000 for organizations that care and support homeless animals.

Do Dah Day is an all-volunteer organization and enlists the support of more than 200 animal-loving volunteers to run the event each year.
